

The pair of parentheses in each instance of the incomplete language repeated above represents the same omitted word.  
This word is to be understood to replace the parentheses to complete the language of any instance of the incomplete language whenever the instance is being attended to.

The word that correctly replaces the parentheses has four syllables and ten letters, beginning with 'i' and ending with 'd,' and means 'recognized, or established as being a particular thing.'  
It can be deduced through attention to the language that it completes given the preceding information.

The circular language begins with *something*. It is to be read through once and partially repeated with the same beginning, ending with the conscious repetition of the word meant to replace the parentheses.

What is specified by any instance of the consciously completed language can be understood through reflection on that language.
